Key Vocabulary

Earth	The planet we live on.
Land	Land is made of rock, sand and soil and is where people live. It looks brown, green or yellow from space.
Water	Water covers most of the Earth and is the blue you can see when looking at a globe or picture of Earth.
Ice	Ice can be found in the North and South pole as these are the coldest parts of the Earth.
Sun	A large ball of gas that Earth moves around. It gives Earth light during the day and heat.
Continent	A large solid area of land. The Earth has seven continents; Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe and Australia.
United Kingdom	The United Kingdom is made up of four nations: England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.
Satellite	A satellite is a small object that orbits around a larger object in space.
Satellite image	A photograph/image taken from space.
Town	A built-up area smaller than a city sometimes.
Map	A drawing of all or part of the Earth's surface.
Orbit	The path that an object takes when it goes around a star, a planet or a moon.
