Develop our observational skills to discuss changes across the four seasons.

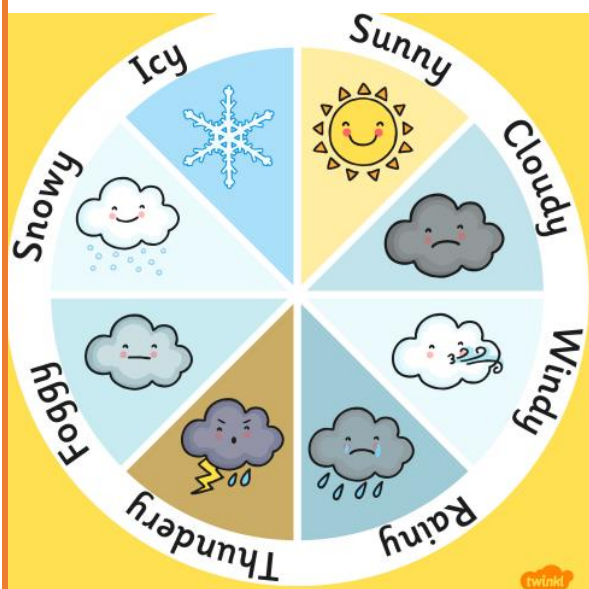
Use specific vocabulary to describe the weather associated with each season.

Observe and discuss how day length varies, in relation to earth's movement in space.

## Key Vocabulary

Seasons	The year is split into four seasons – Winter, Summer, Spring and Autumn
Winter	The weather is cold and the days are short.
Summer	The weather is hot and the days are long.
Spring	The weather is wet and the days are starting to get longer. New buds start to show.
Autumn	The weather begins to get colder and the leaves start to fall from the trees.
Daylight hours	When the sun provides light.
Night-time hours	When the Earth turns into the sun's shadow.
Month	A year is divided into 12 periods, which lasts 28 days or four weeks.
Shadow	A dark area or shape produced by a body coming between rays of light and a surface.
Temperature	The degree of hotness or coldness of an object.
Weather	The conditions in the air above the earth such as wind, rain, or temperature, especially at a particular time over a particular area.
