When? Key Events and Dates				
1815	Grace Darling was born on 24th November, 1815, in Bamburgh, Northumberland.			
1825	When Grace was ten her family moved into a Lighthouse in Longstone, one of the Farne Islands.			
1838	One stormy night Grace looked out of her window and saw there were people clinging onto the rocks. She and her father rowed out to the shipwreck of the SS Forfarshire and rescued nine people. They looked after them for three days until the storm had passed.			
1838	Grace and her father became heroes and were awarded medals for their bravery from Queen Victoria. Queen Victoria gave Grace Darling £50.
